

EASTER SUNDAY is April 12 and we anticipate with great joy our opportunity to celebrate the rising of our Lord Jesus Christ! We will sing, we will share joy, we will declare, "He has risen! He has risen indeed!" We celebrate with disciples across all generations who have been held in awe, wonder and love for how God's love overcomes fear. Only, this year we will be doing it in separate spaces so that we can help our neighbors be safe from illness. Easter will happen, just differently.

I am thankful for the many ways we are able to adapt our means of ministry so that we may continue to be witnesses of God's love.

We cannot know all the emotions of the disciples as they walked with Jesus. Surely there were moments of complete awe and wonder. Each of them may have had a different moment when just walking with Jesus changed their point of view. They may have also walked with some fear and uncertainty as the journey took them to places they had not been and situations they never imagined finding

themselves in. They might have feared the soldiers from Rome and their demands

While we do these things to be stewards of one another's health, our hearts are lifted with the awe and wonder, and we join with the first disciples as we shout and sing "He has risen!"

One tradition of this day is to have a ceremonial foot washing. Today in your home wash your hands remembering Jesus taught us to serve one another. May we humble ourselves to serve our Lord Jesus as he humbled himself for us.

O God, by the example of your Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, you taught us the greatness of true humility, and call us to watch with him in his passion. Give us grace to serve one another in all lowliness and to enter into the fellowship of his suffering; in His name and for His sake. Amen. (United Methodist Book of Worship p. 349)

On this day it is traditional to share in Holy Communion. In your own space, you are invited to share a cup of juice and a piece of bread and remember that you are a loved child of God.

In our service this Friday we will extinguish a candle after portions of the reading, until darkness comes. If you are able you are invited to light a candle before you read the gospel text. When you are finished, blow out the candle, sit for a moment in silence with humility and thanksgiving for what God has done for us.

There's a lot to take in regarding COVID-19 and how the country has gone into virtual lockdown. I have been in a lot of prayer for the health and future of our country. I also have prayed and lost sleep over our mission trips and our youth auction this year. Our youth are home for school learning online, social distancing. Most businesses that would donate to our auction will have closed their doors and may never be able to recover from all the closures. Our youth auction for this year has been cancelled.

With the mission trips ... Louisiana is weeks behind the "curve", and as of now they have thousands of cases, and hundreds of deaths. Portland, our other mission area, will be dealing with cases into the summer months, as the spread is growing.

With that being said and with a heavy heart, we believe it is wise to cancel the mission trips along with the youth auction this year. I will be looking for something that our youth can do that will positively affect our community in and around the church this summer, as we know that our community will need help emerging from this crisis. I also want to acknowledge that this year's group of senior youth would be invited to next year's mission trip if their schedules allow them.

These have not been easy decisions, and we have poured over federal, state, and Methodist conference information as well as lost many hours of sleep, coming to these conclusions. I care for the safety and health of our youth. Please, if there are questions or concerns, contact me whenever you can.

## Help Us Bring Hope and Safety to Those Sleeping in Their Vehicles

There are many reasons a person finds themselves sleeping in their vehicle. Through SafePark, local churches provide a place for those sleeping in their vehicle to be safe while they work to stabilize their lives. State and federal governments permit faith communities to use their property (including parking lots) and their resources to carry out their mission. In many cities, church parking lots are the only places for people to park and sleep legally.

## SafePark supports congregations who are offering hospitality to those sleeping in their cars in Clark County.

Vancouver FUMC explored SafePark and determined that our location has too many barriers to be successful. Instead, we pledged our financial support to Mill Plain UMC's SafePark site. The cost is \$225 per month. If you would like to donate, make out your check to FUMC and note SafePark on the memo line. Any amount you can provide is greatly appreciated. Referral Stats

We receive twice as many referrals from May 1 to Oct 31st. I believe this is in correlation to the Winter Hospitality Overflow opening and colder weather.

We receive 12 referrals per week on average.

Go Connect's mission is to Connect people together to share in the love of God by meeting practical needs, fostering lasting relationships, and building authentic community. We do this through programs such as SafePark. SafePark works with local churches who desire to meet a very real and practical need for people who are sleeping in their vehicles by opening up their parking lots for a specific timeframe each day and give people a sense of security and respite.

Churches open a portion of their parking lot from 5pm to 9am, times vary based on the church. A porta-potty is provided for the guests to use.

We started this program after a very specific conversation we had with a young lady whom we met during one of our outreach service days. She told us she was living in her car and we spent some time talking about safety and security. We told her about this program we were thinking of and she started to cry a bit. She went on to encourage us to continue building what we now know as SafePark. This young gal told us a story that precipitated the fuel behind this effort. It was a story of her first night in the car when someone broke her window and attacked her. As we looked at the broken glass and the broken girl, we knew we had to do something. The result is SafePark.
